Message from the Board Chair

Dear Friends of the Foundation,

It has been my privilege to serve with a very dedicated Board of Directors this year and it is with great pride and excitement that I share our 2012-2013 Annual Report with you.

The Alexandria Public Schools Education Foundation (APSEF) is a growing organization which is governed by a 13 member volunteer board. The foundation has had a significant impact on District 206.

Thanks to the support of many, the foundation has:

- Awarded 21 grants totaling over \$75,000 to Alexandria School District 206 teachers and schools to fund innovative teaching ideas.
- Raised \$4,000,000 to support the construction of the new Alexandria Area High School. Currently over \$1.5 million has been applied to the high school project.

What's remarkable is that this has been accomplished in five short years (2009-2013) through the generosity of those who have stepped up and donated to the foundation!

Through the Innovation Grant Program, the foundation has increased learning opportunities for students in every school and at all grade levels. The foundation fills a unique role in District 206. We strive to be the catalyst that turns an innovative teaching idea into action! Each year thoughtful and caring teachers write creative applications for funds that will bring their idea to life. These ideas may include new teaching materials to support curriculum, or the use of new technologies in the classroom so that teachers are able to make learning much more interactive and engaging for students. With financial support from the foundation, projects featuring several technology platforms, including iPads, ebooks, robotics, and interactive response systems were implemented across the district this past school year. We expect the interest and need to continue to grow.

Our ability to support innovative, quality educational experiences in the classroom depends upon the strength of our financial resources. I encourage you to renew your pledge or consider a donation. Together, we can make an impact and increase learning opportunities for all district students.

The Alexandria Public Schools Education Foundation (APSEF) raises funds to support innovative programs and initiatives that support student learning. The foundation's annual pledge drive, along with two special events – the Hall of Fame and Jeans & Jewels Gala – raised more than \$45,000 last fall. A portion of the monies raised help strengthen the foundation's endowment fund, as well as the teacher grants program, to help ensure future excellence and innovation in our schools.

"On behalf of the entire foundation, we'd like to thank all the patrons and volunteers for making these events so successful," said foundation chair Greg Trumm. "Our success means that our students and teachers can have important resources that can make the teaching and learning environment even more meaningful."

The Innovation Grant program is designed to provide teachers with the opportunity to improve student achievement and learning through innovative and creative practices. Qualifying projects are proposed by teachers and administrators, and are evaluated in a competitive review process by APSEF board members. Those which best meet the foundation's objectives are recommended for funding and implementation.

Students district-wide have benefited from projects funded in the areas of technology equipment; literacy enrichment and intervention programs and equipment; materials for math, reading and writing improvement; science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) programs.

The Education Foundation is independent from the School District but works closely with the Board of Education and District 206. It is governed by a volunteer Board of Directors comprised of business and community leaders, parents, alumni, retired teachers, and staff members.

Innovation Grant funds of **\$7,000** provided for the purchase of LEGO MINDSTORMS® robotics kits, supporting hands-on delivery of science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) concepts to high potential students in grades 4-6.



A Innovation Grant award for **\$630** provided for hands-on classroom labs and demonstrations to promote locally grown food and connections to good health and nutrition.

District 206 hosted its fourth annual Student Showcase Celebration on March 14 at Discovery Middle School. This event is sponsored in part by APSEF and showcases the talent and creative projects of District 206 students.

Innovative Teaching Grants

Foundation Awards \$20,000 in Teacher Grants for 2013-2014

The foundation recently awarded \$20,000 in teacher grants to fund student-engaged projects planned for the 2013-2014 school year that will enrich learning and encourage classroom innovation. Projects funded include:

THE FLIPPED CLASSROOM

- **\$7,400** will provide for the purchase of ultrabooks, tablets, iPads, and iPad minis in order to expand on the secondary instructional and learning process in select math, science, social and world languages classrooms.
- **\$3,500** will allow for a more challenging and rigorous level of glass fusion for 6th graders; introduce glass blowing and glass fusion for high school curriculum; and continue and expand glass fusion through District 206 Community Education. Grant dollars will allow for the purchase of kilns, glass accessories and supplies, along with glass blowing training.
- **\$3,500** will provide for updating sewing technology by purchasing computerized machines, curriculum and design software to support middle school family & consumer sciences curriculum. It will also allow for the use of unconventional materials to learn production skills, technical reading, entrepreneurship, vocational skills and teamwork.
- **\$3,300** will give preschoolers access to technology tools like iPads and ProScope handheld digital microscopes in order to explore materials, record information, and take pictures, promoting scientific thinking and problem solving skills.
- **\$2,300** will enable students to collaborate with peers, analyze and synthesize information and utilize technology skills to create digital stories. Using an iPad for video recording, a green screen, and an iMac for video editing, students will bring science, social studies, and literacy to life as they share what they have learned.

High School Project Update

Thanks to a capital campaign spearheaded by the foundation in 2011, \$4 million was raised to support the construction of the new **Alexandria Area High School**.

The three-story classroom wing is well underway and you can start to feel the spaces taking shape. The exterior metal stud framing is complete and fireproofing is being applied. As weather permits, contractors will complete the roofing systems, concrete work, exterior brick, and window installation.



Throughout the gymnasium and performing arts areas the roofing systems are complete and mechanical, electrical and plumbing (MEP) systems are being installed.



Over the student commons "the heart of the school", the glu laminated beams and roof structure is being installed.

On the site, road ways are in and utilities are complete. Over the summer and fall, contractors will complete final site work for the fields, stadium, tennis courts, parking lots, and landscaping.

Milestone Reunion

In partnership with School District 206, the foundation supports opportunities for alumni to gather together. What better opportunity to plan something unique and special than with the opening of a new state-of-the-art high school!

Alexandria Area High School is expected to be ready for the opening of school in September 2014. More important, it should also be ready for tours during the summer or fall when many classes are holding reunions. Five-year to fifty-year milestone anniversary classes in 2014 include: 2009, 2004, 1999, 1994, 1989, 1984, 1979, 1974, 1969, and 1964.
