He studied Speech Communication at Pennsylvania State University. Jay is married to Dr. Deborah Dittberner. They moved to Alexandria in 1995 and have three graduates of Alexandria Public Schools.

Scholarship Awards

The Foundation wants to build a financial cornerstone for investing in students and teachers in Alexandria Public Schools. One of the ways we do that is by helping students attain college degrees. Through a competitive scholarship process, the Foundation financially supports the transition from high school to 2 to 4-year colleges. The purpose is to make the cost of a college education more affordable for students.
